U. S. DEPT. OF AGRICULTURE.

looking to the suspension during the period of the war of the enforcement of the United States grain standards act and the grading system established under that act have been brought to the attention of the United States Food Administration Grain Corporation and the United States Department of Agriculture. After a conference between officials of those organizations, the following announcement was made:

All purchases of wheat over which the United States Food Administration Grain Corporation has control will be made according to the grades of the official grain standards of the United States from No. 1 to No. 3, and below No. 3 after examination of actual samples of the wheat. The enforcement of the grain standards act will not be suspended by the Government, but on the contrary the United States Food Administration Grain Corporation and the United States Department of Agriculture will co-operate in carrying out its provisions so as to obtain the most beneficial results to all concerned. It appears that confusion has arisen on account of the unfamiliarity of many persons in the grain trade with the new standards and also on account of unwarranted practices that have arisen recently, such as the arbitrary assignment of a lower numerical grade to wheat by reason of the presence of dockage, notwithstanding the fact that dockage does not properly enter into the assignment of the numerical grade. Every effort will be made to eliminate these abuses, to bring about the just application of the official standards and to establish fair dealings. It must be remembered that the Food Administration Grain Corporation is compelled to buy within the limits of fixed prices, and that the Department of Agriculture must see that the standards are correctly applied. Co-operation of producers, the grain trade, and the milling interests with the Food Administration and the Department of Agriculture is required in handling the situation which has arisen as a result of the war crisis.
