Unexplored Areas in Canada

A very common impression held even by Canadians is that there is little Canadian territory left to explore except on the Arctic islands. But as far back as 1829 Dr. George Dawson had calculated that there were then about 1,000,000 square miles of unexplored territory in Canada, about 650,000 square miles in western Canada, the rest lying in the provinces of Ontario and Quebec.

Charles Camsell of the geological survey of Canada recently revised Dr. Dawson's estimate, reaching for western Canada the figures of about 642,000 square miles, while the unexplored area of northern Quebec is represented by 250,000 square miles.

The total area of Canada is reckoned at 3,720,000 square miles, of which 520,000 square miles are embraced in the islands of the Arctic ocean. The unexplored area (Camsell figures) of 901,000 square miles represents almost 28 per cent of the total area of the country.—Exchange.

Ocean Cannibals

Such fierce carnivorous fishes as exist in the depths of the ocean are unknown at the surface. There is a "black swallower" which devours other finny creatures ten times as big as itself, literally climbing over its victim, first with one jaw and then with the other. Another species is nearly all mouth, and, having no power of locomotion, it lies buried in the soft ooze at the bottom, its head alone protruding, ready to engulf any prey that may wander into its carnivorous jaws. There is a ferocious kind of shark resembling a huge eel. All of these monsters are black as ink. Some of them are perfectly blind, while others have enormous, goggling eyes. No ray of sunlight ever pierces the dark, unfathomed caves in which they dwell. Each species is gobbled by the species next bigger, for there is no vegetable life to feed on.
