146 U. OF O. STUDENTS IN U. S. SERVICE

Eugene, Ore., Oct. 17.—One hundred and forty-six University of Oregon students have left the University to take up military service, according to statistics compiled today in the office of A. R. Tiffany, registrar. It is declared likely that other students have gone to the colors whose names have not been turned into the registrar's office.

The largest single group of Oregon men enlisted is the 46 who are in the coast artillery stationed at Fort Stevens. Another group of 36 in the Eugene ambulance corps is now in training at American Lake.

PACIFIC COAST HAS DOLLAR FAMINE

Tacoma, Wash., Oct. 17.—The Pacific Coast is suffering a dollar famine.

Efforts to obtain a large number of silver dollars or dollar bills in Seattle, Portland and San Francisco by the paymaster's department at Camp Lewis failed and a hurry-up order for a shipment may be sent to Washington.

Bankers explain that the dollar famine is due to the fact that many are hoarding dollars. The prevailing market price of silver is high and some figure that with the next advance a silver dollar may contain more than 100 cents worth of metal. The shortage of coins naturally heaps more work on the dollar bill.

Eugene, Ore., Oct. 17.—The annual convention of the Oregon Congress of Mothers and Parent-Teachers' Associations opened here today for a three-day session. Practically every county in the state is represented.
