## PICTURES FAN CAMPAIGN FOR LIBERTY LOAN

### MOVIE ENACTS GRIPPING TALE OF GERMAN OUTRAGES IN BELGIUM.

PORTLAND, Or., Oct. 25.—Portland's campaign for the Liberty Bonds was fanned to fever heat Tuesday. The wonderful feature about it is that a motion picture, accomplished it. Remarkable as was the speech of Cyrus Peirce, member of the national speakers' committee of the Liberty Loan, more striking was the official French picture "In the Wake of the Huns," which absolutely gripped and enthralled a vast audience. "In the Wake of the Huns" portrayed grippingly just what the Germans have done to Northern France and Belgium. First hand motion pictures of outrages committed at one time actually had the audience sobbing. Working it up to a magnificent climax with the victorious French troops advancing finally enthusing completely the audience with the first portrayal of American troops in France.

"No words of mine," said Peirce, "can be a greater advertisement for the Liberty Bonds than this amazing pictorial portrayal of what Germany has done and would do to America had she but the chance."  
The Peirce meeting is expected to give the Portland campaign a tremendous impetus.

### GERMAN AND UNITED STATES WAR LOAN COMPARED

WASHINGTON, Oct. 21.—(By Mail.)—The American people have as yet had practically no casualties in this war. They have, to date, subscribed \$2,000,000,000 to the Second Liberty Loan.

The German people have suffered casualties of 8,500,000 men, and the German people last week subscribed to the Seventh war loan of that country \$3,107,500,000.

That was the startling picture displayed by Treasury Department Officials tonight.

"Under these circumstances," they asked, "are the American people content to let this comparison stand?"  
They believe that the answer will be a rousing "NO!"

But the "NO" must be spelled out in millions of dollars a day between now and the close of the campaign on Saturday at noon.
