CAMP MILLS, L. I., N. Y., Oct. 16.

My Dear Mr. Leiter: Was somewhat shocked upon receiving a wire today from The La Grande Observer, dated Oct. 15, regarding rumor that Oregon's Field Hospital had been submerged. It beats the devil how these reports get circulated. Doesn't it? Of course though La Grande is interested in our movements and as it was reported that we were to sail some time ago, it is natural that nerves are on edge and imagination vivid among our dear friends at home.

We do expect to go at any time now and no doubt will receive orders before the last of this week. Our supplies were loaded for transportation last week, and this morning our personal baggage left. We are somewhat on edge ourselves and are all anxiously awaiting the word go.

The boys are all fine, healthy and happy and I am sure will represent dear old Oregon in creditable manner while in action with the men of the Rainbow Division.

It is my understanding that all of the division will not embark at this time, about one-third will remain at Camp Mills and be moved later. No trouble is anticipated with the subs. The Government is moving troops across right along and the transports are so carefully guarded that it would be impossible for a submarine to get close. I heard that it was reported in La Grande that we were going to Cuba, can't understand where such a story could start. There is no question in my mind but that we are going to France.

I can realize more every day what an honorable act it is for a man to be taking part in this great battle for humanity.

Professor Fulton, of Reed College, was out to pay us a visit Sunday. He has just returned from Europe, and says that Germany's many outrages have not been overestimated.

Kindly give my regards to Mrs. Leiter, Don, Charles and Mrs. Stevens and Mr. and Mrs. Eddie Ford, not overlooking yourself.

AMERICAN SOLDIERS WILL RECEIVE XMAS PRESENTS

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 26.—Christmas presents are on their way to American soldiers in France from Portland today. The names and addresses of 260 Oregonians with American forces across the Atlantic were secured and each will receive a package.

Each Christmas package contains five packages of cigarettes, two

packages of cigarette papers, three packages of tobacco, one pipe, one deck of cards, five packages of chewing gum, two bars of soap, one package of note paper, twenty-five envelopes, one pencil with eraser, one toothbrush, one tube of tooth paste, one steel trench mirror, three packages of handkerchiefs and six packages of hard chocolate.
