AMERICAN CHEESE CHEAPER IN LONDON THAN U. S.

PORTLAND, Ore., Oct. 27.—Department of commerce officials today announced that American cheese is cheaper in London than in America.

That today was the explanation of Oregon cheese exporters when shown United Press figures comparing the retail price of cheese in London and principal American cities.

The British government buys the cheese output of Canada for 21 3/4 cents a pound f. o. b. eastern Canada ports and sells the cheese to English dealers with the restriction that it cannot be resold for over 33 cents a pound, one exporter explained.

SECRETARY BAKER'S APPEARANCE SHOCKS SMALL BOY.
