in creating the National Council of Defense and of the patriotic work of the business men of the country were doing without pay. Colon B. Eborhard toasted the Democratic party, and E. E. Bragg paid his compliments to the Republican party. A. C. Hampton spoke on education and the war and emphasized the necessity for steady devotion on the part of public school students to their daily studies. H. E. Coolidge assured the Vice-President that the Home Guards were with the President to a man. Walter M. Pierce spoke of "Rural Communities and the War," telling of the effect the war had had upon them, of the questions that were concerning the people, and of their determination to stand back of the President every man and woman.
