LA GRANDE MODERN BAKERY

La Grande has one of the most modern and sanitary bakeries in Oregon in the plant of the Duttli Bakery on Fir Street. Fred Duttli, the proprietor, came from St. Gallen, Switzerland, to Union county in 1892. He served an apprenticeship of four years and was a journeyman baker in Switzerland's great lace center for another four years before emigrating to America. Mr. Duttli twelve years ago went to work for the Staples Bakery when it was a wooden building on the same lot where the present modern brick building is now located. At that time the bakery turned out less than 200 loaves per day. Eight years ago Mr. Duttli purchased the plant, and three years ago he built the present brick building as a modern up-to-date sanitary bakery. The cost of the building, including sidewalks, sewers and street improvements exceeded \$10,000. The ovens are modern Stevens ovens with steam blast attachment, and contain more bricks than an average residence, costing over \$2,000 to install. The bakery floor is of concrete. Power mixers and kneaders for preparing the bread are used so that the baker's hands do not touch the flour or dough.

Nearly 4,000 loaves of bread are baked every day, the ovens having a capacity of 400 loaves per hour. Blue Ribbon Bread (the Duttli brand) is wrapped in sanitary paper and shipped to practically every town and camp in Union county. The bread is of the very best quality, sweet and nutritious and full 16 ounces to the 10 cent loaf. Fruit cakes, cookies, pies, etc., are also turned out in quantities. Four bakers are employed as well as an assistant in the shop. As bakers wages are \$22 and board and lodging also, per week, this industry makes a

considerable addition to La Grande's pay roll. In addition to the bakery, Mr. Duttli is also interested in the timber business and his timber, which at present is being logged by Mr. Zick, adds over \$10,000 each summer in the way of a pay roll.

Smith was in an open boat five days. Three of his comrades died and one went insane the day before rescued. Smith never recovered from the effects of the five days.
