OREGON LOGGERS BIG EATERS

Average Meal Weighs 1.97 Pounds—Cost Placed at 27 Cents Per...

PORTLAND, Ore., Nov. 15.—A logger eats an average of 1.97 pounds of food at each meal, according to figures compiled by W. C. Ruegnitz, of the Fridal Vail Lumber company.

His figures are based on detailed reports from seven logging camps. The average total cost for each meal is placed at 27 cents by Ruegnitz. The amount of food consumed at the various camps varied greatly, his figures show. At one camp the average was 2.85 pounds for each man's meal.
