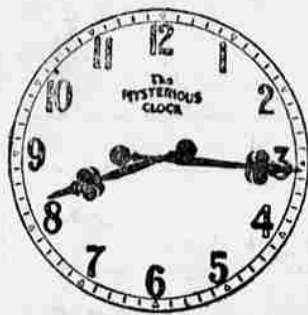

CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

November 14, 1917.  
To the Honorable Commission,  
City of La Grande.

Herewith I submit my report for the week ending November 14, 1917.

Fire chief in his report for the week ending November 11, 1917, reports one alarm. Telephone call announced a fire at Savoy hotel, November 8, but upon arrival of the department, no fire was discovered other than a chimney burning out. No damage done. Seven volunteers responded. Since his report there have been two more calls, both in North La Grande. His next report will show the amount of damage.

Police report for week ending November 11 shows no arrests. Number of lights out, four. Amount received from pound, \$10.50.

Water and Street Superintendent reports an expense for the week of \$108.65 for the two departments, \$31.90 of which is charged to the water department and \$76.75 to the street department.

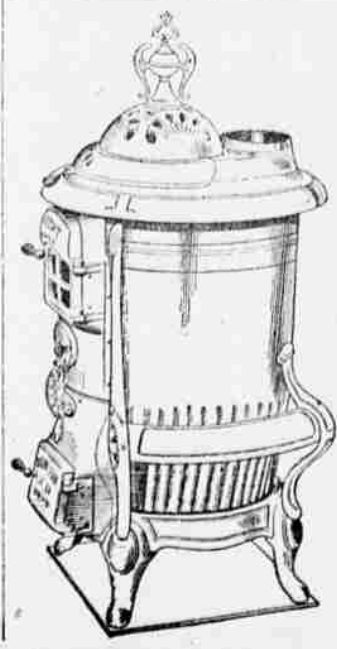
