Visits Here—Miss Eunice Ramsdell is visiting Mrs. S. A. Anderson at Cove and drove to La Grande yesterday for a short visit.

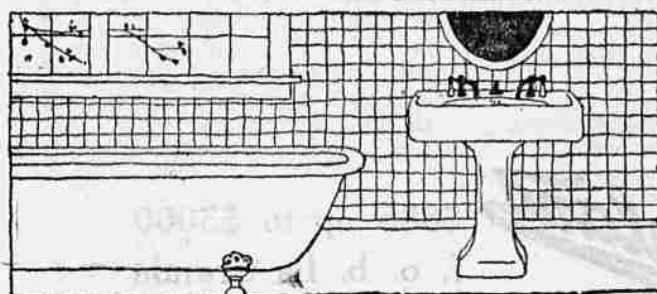
