Blue Mountain Creamery

The Blue Mountain Creamery was incorporated in 1905. The president is E. D. Selder and Mr. G. C. Hopkins holds the position of secretary-treasurer and is the general manager, having held down this position for the past five years.

The creamery distributes a large sum of money to the dairymen of the valley every month. The plant is modern and thoroughly up-to-date. It has a butter capacity of 4000 pounds per day. They make their own ice, the machine turning out 6300 pounds of ice per day, but has a total capacity of ten tons. The balance of the power, however, is used for refrigerating purposes and cooling.

They have a modern ice cream plant, which will be fully equipped this winter. Their churn has a capacity of 900 pounds at one churning. The pasteurizing vat pumps directly into the churn, and the plant has always received favorable reports from the inspectors. Mr. E. W. Cox, whose reputation as a buttermaker is known from Spokane to Tillamook, is the buttermaker in charge of the plant.

FUEL SHORT IN EAST

The fuel and food condition in Oregon is considered bad by many persons, the fuel situation particularly; but read the following extract from a letter, W. G. Sawyer received from his mother in Orange, Mass.:

"This war is enough to finish everybody. We can only get a little coal and wood at a time, and wood is scarce, as men cannot be procured to cut it. Frank (Sawyer's uncle and postmaster of Orange) has not a bit of coal, and now we can only buy two tons of sugar at a time!"

If you cannot sell your fallen and cull apples, or turn them into jelly, apple butter or cider, give them away; do not waste them. California and Utah are not wasting a single apple this year.

The Mammoth Grocery

The Mammoth Grocery on Adams avenue, owned by C. R. Simpkins, is located in a moderny equipped, well lighted building 100 x 40 with a large store room in the rear and a full basement. In this large, light and airy store every thing with the exception of the canned goods is kept under glass and in counter bins with glass fronts, sanitary dust and

fly proof. The store is lighted by the indirect electric system of ceiling lights. Mr. Simpkins is a new man to the grocery trade, having been an office man with the Palmer Lumber Co. for nine years. He is on the floor himself at all times, giving personal attention to his customers. Mrs. Fowler and Herbert Pattison, both experienced grocery clerks, and well known in La Grande, are his efficient assistants. His stock of goods, like his fixtures is new and fresh, nothing being allowed to remain on the shelves long enough to even get a soiled label. His motto is move the goods

and turn that community dollar over and over and keep both the dollar and the goods busy circulating.

ASK FOR AND BUY HOME PRODUCTS

Remember, when you send your money out of town, you lose the benefits of its tax-paying functions. Also remember that your home town probably manufactures many articles. Patronize your home products. Ask your merchant for them. Ask why he does not keep them. Compare their quality and price with goods of the same kind, made in other towns. You will probably find that they are fully as

good, in some cases better. Patronize home industries and keep that dollar circulating in your home town.

Building New Home

Alex Ferguson is building the first home on the new State Highway, a mile and a half this side of Hot Lake. It will be a modern five-room bungalow. R. A. West, who is drilling a

well for Mr. Ferguson, is down 50 feet and putting down a six-inch pipe for artesian water. The first well was abandoned at 45 feet as the water struck was found to be mineralized. This well will be developed later, as the water is reported to be a good mineral drinking water. This is the thirteenth well this season that Mr. West has drilled. The county is pushing work on this road, using an eighty-horsepower tractor, hauling two graders. They are working their first mile of road and making good progress. When finished, this will put the Hot Lake country three miles nearer La Grande. It will also be a road that can be

traveled all winter, as the winds will sweep it clear.
