Notice of School Meeting.

Notice is hereby given to the legal voters of school district No. 1, Union county, State of Oregon, that a school meeting of said district will be held in the Central school building on the 24th day of November, 1917, from 2 o'clock p. m. to 7 o'clock p. m. to submit to the people the following question: "Shall the District School Board of School District No. 1, Union County, State of Oregon, sell the property owned by the district and situate on the corner of Fir and

Jackson streets and described as lots No. 22, 23, 24, 25, and 26 in Block 23 of Predmore's addition to La Grande?" And to vote on the proposition of levying a special district tax.

The total amount of money needed by the district during the fiscal year beginning on June 18th, 1917, and ending June 30th, 1918, is estimated in the following budget and includes the amounts to be received from the County School Fund, State School Fund, Special District Tax and all other moneys of the district:
