LOUISE GLAUM PLAYS VANITY IN NEW TRIANGLE PLAY.

As the personification of Vanity, Louise Glauum makes her appearance in "Idolaters," a Triangle production directed by Walter Edwards, which will be shown at the Arcade theatre Sunday.

Noted for the "spider gown," the peacock dress and the devil robe of "The Wolf Woman," Miss Glauum has become known as "the peacock woman of pictures," and the title will gain new emphasis it is said, when she appears in the startling costumes of "Idolaters."

In this curious boudoir transpire most of the dramatic scenes.

Miss Glauum, whom a noted critic recently declared to be "the screen's most credible vampire," has a part peculiarly fitted to her abilities. She is supported by George Webb, Hugo B. Koch, Milton Ross, Dorcas Mathews, Lee Hill and Thomas S. Gulse.
