Notice: To All Grocers And Retailers Of Sugar

United States Food Administration Federal Food Administrator for Oregon—W. B. Ayer, 401 North-western Bank Building.

Portland, Oregon, Nov. 23, 1917. To All Grocers and Retailers of Sugar Effective November 22, 1917.

Dear Sir:—The following regulations are in effect throughout the State of Oregon:

1. Sales to family consumers are limited to \$1.00 purchases.

2. Persons living at a distance from purchaser points will be permitted to purchase in 55 pound lots.

3. Hotels and restaurants and boarding houses are limited to a ten day supply.

4. Sugar shall not be used as a leader for special sales or to encourage the sale of other merchandise.

5. In exceptional cases, where parties live at long distance from purchasing points, arrangements may be made through this office for sales in such lots, when it is known that sales in lesser quantities will work hardships on purchasers on account of the distance from the source of supply.

6. With reference to time between purchases, this office will not limit the purchases to any specific time, but each retailer is familiar with his customers' methods of purchasing and wherever he knows that a customer is buying in excess of his normal requirements, he is required to report same to this office, as under the new Food Administration Act, hoarding of any food commodities is not permissible, and every retailer must use due precaution in making sugar sales.

WEEKLY LIVESTOCK MARKET REVIEW

PORTLAND, Nov. 28. (Special.)—The week's run at the Portland Union Stockyards has been the lightest for the past three months. The total string of live stock amounted to only 2900 cattle, 4400 hogs and 1400 sheep. While the offering was light the quality of the stock presented, generally speaking, was good, and the light volume came at an opportune time inasmuch as it gave an excellent chance for easing up the crowded situation in the feed lots of the killers, and the weeks work has opened the market thoroughly. Cattle have returned to strong prices and are probably selling better today than on any previous Saturday in six weeks.

Steers which brought 10 cents yesterday were not as good in quality as the steers which brought 10 cents at the high time in the market of the previous month. If a car load of steers were received now that bore the same quality as those which topped the market last month they would unquestionably cross the scales at 10.25 or better, if prices paid indicate demands under present conditions. We quote the following prices for the closing market of the week, which indicate strong conditions and upward tendencies: Medium choice steers, 9.50-10.00; good to medium steers, 8.75-9.50; common to good steers 7.25-8.25; choice cows and heifers, 6.75-7.75; common to good cows and heifers, 5.25-7.00; canners, 4.00-5.25; bulls 4.50-6.75; calves, 7.00-9.50; stockers and feeders, 4.00-7.50.

Hogs have been changing hands promptly on arrival at the yards throughout the week at steady prices. The quality has not been as good at the close of the week as was coming at the week's opening, but while secondary, yet the bulk of the shipment is not poor. All conditions in the hog department are firm and carry a healthful tone. We quote: prime light 16.20-16.40; prime heavy 16.00-16.20; pigs, 13.50-14.25; hulk, 16.20.

The sheep market continues to be rather sluggish with a tendency towards weakening. Yet, very little quality stuff has been sacrificed in price. The general run of this department has barely held its own, with very light receipts and a very light demand. We quote the following prices in this department: Western lambs, 13.50-14.00; valley lambs, 13.00-13.50; yearlings, 12.00-12.50; wethers, 11.75-12.25; ewes, 8.00-10.00.
