Wallowa County Is Having Big Year

Fred M. Smith of Enterprise is visiting his dentist in La Grande and calling on his friends. Mr. Smith states that everything looks bright for his town and that section of Wallowa county.

There had been no snow until a few days ago and stock had been feeding on the higher ranges at least six weeks longer than usual this year and at the present time are fat enough for beef.

The three big sheep men of Wallowa, Fred Faulkner, J. Dobbins and Peter Beudan, have driven their sheep down to the winter pastures on Joseph creek, the Grande Ronde, the Snake river and the Innaha. Wallowa county scarcely has to feed its stock.

Wallowa stock men are constantly improving their cattle and are largely running to Shorthorns, so Mr. Smith states. This year they have sold their herds down rather close, owing to the attractive prices that have prevailed. They feel assured of plenty of hay this winter if the weather is not extra severe and there seems to be every indication of an open winter.

Enterprise has had a wonderful growth, a steady growth justified by surrounding conditions. It has increased from 1240 at the last census to about 3500 today.

The valley raises hay, wheat, oats and barley and is an ideal stock country. All roads and canyons lead to and center in Enterprise and all the stock country for 40 miles is tributary to the town, owing to Joseph creek and other canyons shutting them off. Enterprise is growing steadily and is continuing to grow.

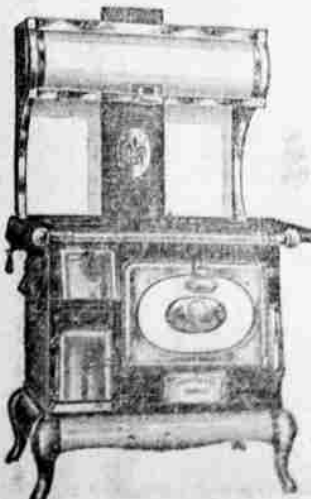
