Legal Advisory Board Appointed

ASSOCIATE MEMBERS WILL ASSIST IN DRAFT

Duty Will Be to Give Advice to Men Who Are to Answer Government's Questions.

The legal advisory board for Union County, appointed by Governor Withycombe and confirmed by the President, has organized and, under the authority given it by the regulations of the War Department, has appointed the associate members for Union County.

It is the duty of all members of the board to give such advice and assistance to all our young men subject to the selective service law as will enable them to properly fill out and fully answer the Questionnaires which will be sent out in installments of five per cent each day beginning December 15, and continuing for 20 days, and giving each registrant seven days in which to answer the Questionnaire. It is the duty of the members of this board to give freely and without charge all possible advice and assistance in this matter in order that the new classification under the selective service law may be completed at the earliest possible moment, and that all questions be properly and fully answered in order that the new classifications may be correctly made.
