Invented in La Grande.

The rotary plow, now in general use on northern railroads, was the invention of Lewis Bergendahl, at the time an employee of the O.-W. R. & N. Co., as machinist in charge of pumping stations on lines in Eastern Oregon.
The first rotary came to the O.-W. R. & N. in 1886. J. F. Graham, now superintendent of motive power, was at that time master mechanic of the company's shops at La Grande, Ore., and gave the rotary its first practical test. Bergendahl did not profit through his invention. After many months' study and experiment he completed a working model at a cost of \$5000. This was sent east and it is alleged other persons began manufacturing plows from the model. Litigation followed and Mr. Bergendahl had as his attorney Roscoe Conklin, who died while the case was still in court. It is understood the inventor now lives in California, possessing no material reminder of his most helpful creation.—Portland Journal.
