To support the national administration and the heads of the government with all my ability and energy in the speedy and vigorous prosecution of the war to a peace satisfactory to the democracy of the world and compatible with the highest ideals of our civilization.

To the application of the selective draft in practice as well as theory, which shall insure organization of the national army and at the same time reserve the necessary labor and supplies for the continuation of our industrial pursuits and commerce. 3. To an equitable control and regulation of food supplies, commerce and industry, and the establishment of a primary market in Portland on equal basis with Chicago and eastern ports. 4. To a nation-wide prohibition and to all measure which shall make it practicable and operative and not theoretical. 5. To permanently establish equal suffrage in both state and nation. 6. To establishment by the federal government of a naval base at the mouth of the Columbia River. 7. To effective rural credit legislation and administration with a particular view to its adaptability to the needs of Oregon. 8. To construction by the federal government of a military highway along the Pacific Coast, and federal aid in the construction of permanent highways. 9. To see that Oregon participates, all things being equal, in national trade, commerce and industry, and that our state is given recognition in the federal expenditures made necessary by the war. 10. To legislation which shall bring to a settlement the public lands question, and the greater development of Oregon's natural resources including the development of water power, reclamation of arid, swamp and logged off lands. 11. To the organization and mobilization of all our industrial forces, with a just and proper consideration of the rights of labor, which shall guarantee coordination of American efforts during the war. 12. To legislation that will permit the natural resources of the great West and Alaska to be used, at the same time being careful that these natural resources are used economically. 13. To the removal of the misunderstanding and opposition on the part of the federal authorities which has restricted Oregon's commercial expansion and retarded her industrial development. 14. To the development of Oregon's great shipping ports, through federal improvement of waterways and harbors; the maintenance of a merchant marine of the Pacific Ocean, and a just recognition on the part of the federal government of the importance, value, commercial and industrial advantage of Oregon's location, situation and harbor and shipping facilities. 15. To a policy of conservation and reconstruction which shall insure our national integrity, honor and commerce and the moral and civic purity of our people. 16. To have that high regard and consideration for the interests and progress of humanity and the nation at large, which is typified by a conscientious and moral observance of true Christian civilization.

PORTLAND MARKETS

PORTLAND, Jan. 18 - Today's offering showed a fairly heavy run of valley hogs, a very light run of cattle and a fair supply of sheep, very few of which were on the open market.

The cattle market was very active throughout the day and everything that was offered, which contained nothing qualified to really test the market, changed hands at the top of the quotations throughout the various classes. The bulk of the offerings in the yards today were discarded from dairies and drive lots of questionable quality. There have been no steers on the market since Monday. One of the heaviest demands in the cattle department is for feeder steers of a thin quality, of which the supply is entirely inadequate.

Offerings in the hog alley continue to be of inferior quality although they have gone readily at the top end of the quotations. Hogs are really about 10c better than quotations previously put down. We quote as follows: Prime lights, 15.55-15.70; prime heavys, 15.60-15.75. The supply is inadequate for the demands and a heavy shipment would be absorbed readily under existing conditions in the yards.

No change developed in the sheep market during the day, general conditions continuing about the same as shown in previous reports.

The following quotations prevail in the different departments of the market: Medium to choice steers, 10.00-10.75; good to medium steers, 8.75-10.00; common to good steers, 7.25-8.75; choice cows and heifers, 7.25-8.00; common to good cows and heifers, 6.00-7.35; canners, 3.00-5.50; bulls, 4.50-7.00; calves, 7.00-10.25; stockers and feeders, 6.00-8.50.

HOGS - Pigs, 13.50-14.50; bulk, 15.60.

SHEEP - Western lambs, 14.50-15.00; Valley lambs, 14.00-14.25; yearlings, 12.50-13.00; wethers, 12.00-12.50; ewes, 9.50-10.00.

FIREMAN FABRICATING FABRIC FRAGMENTS FOR FIGHTERS

WASHINGTON, Jan. 19. - It's a long time between fires. So the firemen knit for the Red Cross. They're doing it all over the country, the Red Cross told the United Press today.

Sister Susie and her well known habit of sewing shirts for soldiers has been outclassed. The firemen are fabricating fragments of fabric for fighters.

Chest, checkers, cards and newspapers pile in time. The substitution of motors for horses in many city fire departments has even relieved the firemen of the task of carrying and feeding the horses.

So the firemen knit. One of the first experiments in having firemen knit was in Rochester, N. Y., where George Eastman, the kodak man and a prominent

worker in the Rochester Red Cross Chapter, hit upon the idea of enlisting firemen in Red Cross work.

Knitting machines were provided and the men now have competition as to the length of time required to make a sock, and also the quantity that can be turned out in a day. The firemen are very glad to have something to do in their leisure time and are producing a large number of socks.

The probability of utilizing the leisure time of the thousands of firemen throughout the country has been suggested to the three thousand chapters of the country, and the firemen's assistance in supplying socks to soldiers and sailors will be solicited by the local chapter.
