PARAMOUNT DIRECTOR OVERCOMES LIGHTING PROBLEM

Star Delighted With Treatment Received in Portland.

As an example of the difficulties that sometimes confront directors of motion pictures and exemplifying their ingenuity in overcoming them, it was found that after having journeyed all the way from Hollywood, California, to Portland, Oregon, to take scenes in a prominent hotel there for Julian Eltinge's second Paramount picture, "The Clever Mrs. Carfax," that the lighting facilities were inadequate; that is to say, insufficient current precluded the possibility of making interior scenes in that particular hotel.

There was considerable discussion and much chaffin, but finally Donald Crisp, the director of the picture "The Clever Mrs. Carfax," hit upon the idea of having all the sections of the big hotel lobby flash-lighted. From these pictures the entire lobby was reproduced at the huge Paramount studios at Hollywood, California.

Julian Eltinge, star of the production, who made such a sensation in

"The Countess Charming," which was his first screen production and made by Paramount, declares that he was "delighted" with the manner in which he was received in Portland, Oregon.

"It is almost as fine to be a motion picture actor as to be the President. The way they feted me, the manner in which I was escorted from place to place, together with the other members of the company and Mr. Crisp, my director, under the auspices of the Chamber of Commerce and the city officials, was mighty fine, let me tell you."

Mr. Eltinge, whose female impersonations surpass anything that has ever been attempted along that line upon either stage or screen, is more than pleased with his work in motion pictures so far. He declares that it opens up many new channels for his characterizations and he believes that "The Clever Mrs. Carfax" will be hard to beat.

"FIGHTING BACK"

A familiar figure in fiction, the army officer who has been unjustly convicted of betraying his country comes to the front as the central character in "Fighting Back," a five-part Triangle melodrama taken from a story by Harry Shumate, the scenario by Alvin H. Neitz. Dance hall and ranch life in the west are depicted in the play. When first introduced the officer is staggering painfully across the desert, ragged and footsore. He has escaped from prison and his disgrace has evidently deprived him of all his spirit and manhood. He finds refuge on the ranch of James Newton, where he becomes known as the Weakling and is made the butt of the other cow-punchers. On pay day the boys drag him off to town and force him to enter one of the dance halls. A girl named Fury is attracted by him but he repulses her. Later on she arouses the hidden courage of the man and he fights and overcomes China Mex, the proprietor of the dance hall and frees the girl from the man. He then takes her back to his old command, determines to make a desperate attempt to establish his innocence and finds that a confession by the real culprit has restored his reputation.

Wm. Desmond has a strenuous part that he carries with conviction. Claire McEwen plays the Fury with her usual capability as an actress. Jack Richardson, Curley Baldwin, Pete Morrison, William Ellingford, Thomas H. Guise, Thornton Edwards and Josie Sedgwick lend efficient aid. The production, directed by Raymond Wells, calls for commendation. Fancy riding and broncho busting are entertaining features of a Fourth of July celebration that takes place during the unfolding of the plot.

### PHESAGES NEW WAR ON HOSPITAL SHIPS

German Newspaper Insinuates Allies Are Using Them for Illegal Purposes.

ROTTERDAM, Jan. 24.—Although German news agencies continue to assert that the British hospital ship Rowa, which was sunk recently in the Bristol Channel, must have been destroyed by a mine, there are indications of a fresh campaign against hospital ships. These take the form of a revival of the accusations of misuse of the Red Cross such as preceded earlier crimes.

A significant article appears in the Kolnische Volks Zeitung. Opening with the assertion that Spanish officers left their posts as neutral observers on British hospital ships because they discovered these ships were carrying troops supposed to be suffering from fever, but really quite healthy, the paper says:

use of hospital ships has been established. The greater part of the withdrawal from the Dardanelles was effected by means of hospital ships on which were carried a few wounded but many more un wounded. But for these breaches of the Geneva convention the greater part of the Dardanelles troops would have been destroyed.

"Now, again, similar misuse has been proved. The misuse has not yet led to our fleet in general regarding the hospital ships as wearing a deceptive mark and drawing the necessary conclusions."
