## BUSH LEAGUE MANAGER OF CARDINALS NEVER OUT OF FIRST DIVISION.

"All doubts that a 'bush leaguer' is capable of properly managing a big league ball club and bringing it down the stretch against the hardest kind of opposition took when Clarence Rowland led the White Sox to victory in the American League and then outgeneraled the 'Little Napoleon' of baseball, John McGraw, in the world series. Partly for these reasons and partly for the admiration he had for baseball ability and brains Branch Rickey, president of the St. Louis Cardinals, will put the

first bush league manager in charge of a National League club this spring when Jack Hendricks goes to the helm. Huge Bezdek cannot be considered a bush leaguer for he had never played or managed in any league before going to Pittsburgh. Hendricks has served for 12 years as manager of minor league clubs. In that time he has finished first five times, second three times, third three times and fourth once. He has never been out of the first division.
