AUTO TOPICS

Auto Show Opens Tonight.
PORTLAND, Feb. 7.—Portland's ninth annual Automobile and Tractor Show, one of the biggest events of the year in West Coast motor-dom, opens tonight at the Civic auditorium. For a week thereafter automobile, truck and tractor manufacturers and dealers will vie with each other in displaying the peculiar advantages of their own cars, and novel stunts and tests with motive power will be daily attractions.

Governor James Withycombe, members of the State Highway commission, Mayor Baker and other state and city officials will participate in the opening exercises. A delegation of Puget Sound and Spokane automobile men is expected to-night or tomorrow.

That the automobile has proven itself to be a necessity in war as well as peace will be shown by special exhibits of militarized cars and trucks, ambulances, etc. The tractor's increasing popularity on the farm calls forth a most complete line of gas steers for any sized ranch, with special demonstrations to prove their worth.
