Roy Currey will change his tune by the time he is in France four or five months. He will find the French with a helping hand at all times; they have treated us Engineers with the utmost courtesy and respect.

I have just received a scrap book, presented by the Girls' National Honor Guard of Oregon; merci beaucoup (thanks very much) to the Oregon girls.

I saw Heber Conrad the other day. He is feeling fine; we see each other quite often and talk about old times in La Grande, the Valley and our old school days, so you see it does not make any difference how far you travel you will find somebody that knows you. I saw a Canadian Engineer here that I knew in Lethbridge, Alberta, Canada. He fired there for the Canadian Pacific railway. He sure was surprised to see me here in France in Uncle Sam's uniform.

We had a splendid turkey dinner Christmas; it sure was a treat that Uncle Sam gave his boys, especially in time of war and considering how far he had to ship it and dodge the submarines.

playes returned to work in one yard when the company offered them the wages demanded, pending mediation by the government.

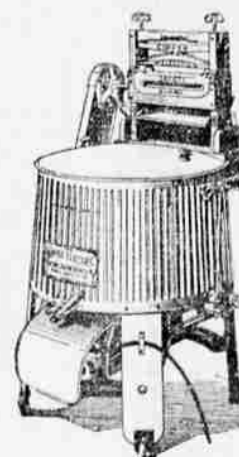
