HOSPITAL BOYS MAY GET CLARK

That there is a probability that the authorities will be able to assign Rev. G. L. Clark, pastor of the Presbyterian church of this city for a number of years, to active duty with the La Grande hospital unit, is indicated by a letter from D. A. Davis, directeur adjoint in France, for the Y. M. C. A. activities. A letter dated January 29, addressed to City Manager Fred B. Currey, contains information which enthralls those who have been working on the proposition of having Rev. Clark, now in France doing Y. M. C. A. work, transferred to the division where his former compatriots from La Grande are now on duty. The letter says:

"My Dear Mr. Currey:—I am very grateful to you for the letter which you and Mr. Scroggin wrote in regard to the Rev. G. L. Clark. I shall be very glad to take up with Mr. Carter the question of a special assignment as you request. The only thing I fear is that your letter arrived after Mr. Clark had been assigned and sent to the field, even if this is true it may be that later he can be re-assigned or his post shifted in such a way that he will come in contact with the unit from your city. I am sure that Mr. Clark's broad experience fits him admirably to render a large and useful service to our men in this country, our only regret is that we did not have a larger number of such men earlier in the game.

"You will be interested to know that our Association is rendering a unique and most important service for the French army as well as for the American army. At the present time we have about 150 Americans in this branch of the service and they are having the opportunity of their lives to make the best things in our own country known to the people of France. The gratitude of the French soldiers for what the American secretaries are being able to do in the way of organizing games, sports and canteens in the camps at the French front, is beyond description.
