**Knitters, Attention!**  
On account of a new ruling, only one kind of a garment can be shipped in a box. This rule applies to knitting as well as other garments. On this Saturday then the Chapter will ship a box of sweaters, and next week a box of socks. We will need 150 sweaters to fill the box. Will you bring in a sweater before Saturday? Last week the Chapter received 101 sweaters and rejected only one. Let this be a hundred per cent sweater week. It is still necessary to call attention to a few points that are overlooked occasionally. "Knit 2, pul 2" is the rule for all purling. The purling should never be stretched out flat. The purpose of purling is to make the garment fit close. It loses all elasticity when ironed or stretched flat in some other way.

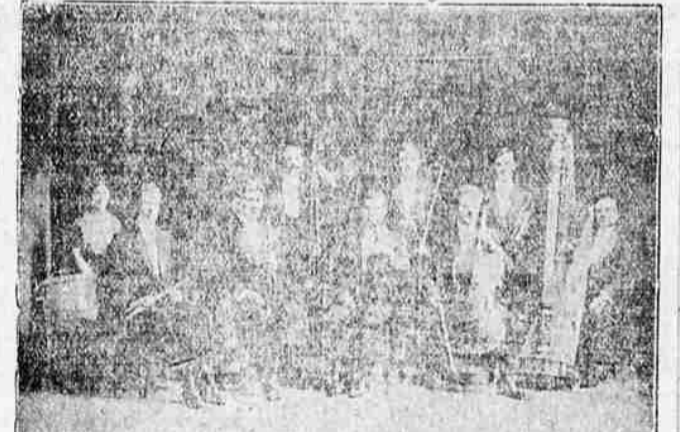
