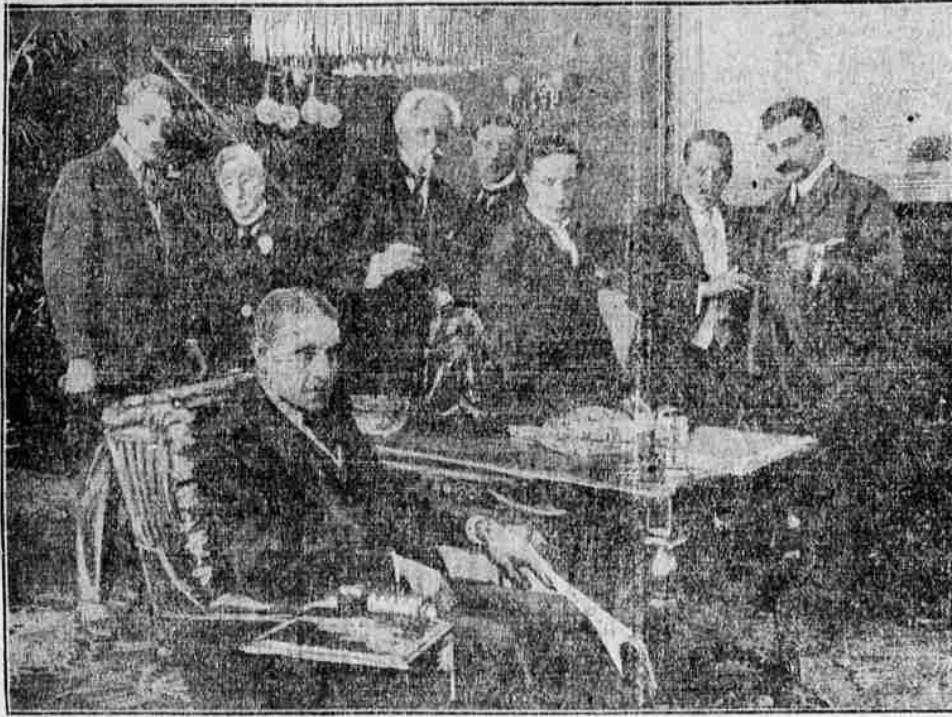

#### CHEAPER ROCK RATES WANTED BY BUILDERS

NEWPORT, Or., Feb. 22.—Captain O. F. Jacobson and A. U. Berry of the Miami construction company have asked the public service commission at Salem to fix a rate for the transportation of rock for jetty work from the Pioneer quarry to Yaquina, over the Yaquina branch of the Southern Pacific. General freight agent Henshaw of the railroad quoted a rate of twenty-five cents per ton but the San Francisco officials of the railroad raised this to fifty cents, which is considered nearly prohibitive.

At a meeting of the Newport commercial club it was decided to file a complaint with the public service commission against the Southern Pacific to have the railroad show cause why its road should not be extended to Newport.

#### Gives Up Auto Show.

Pendleton has given up her annual auto show, according to reports from across the mountains from the Roundup town, for reasons that the dealers believe it is an inopportune time for such demonstration. It is urged by many, however, that this is the wrong conclusion for the Portland show this year was the greatest of any yet held and a half million dollars worth of cars were sold during the exhibition.

#### Travel Not Heavy at Present.

The quiet travel season is now on, according to the railroad men. This is partly due to the off-season which always occurs at this time of the year and is further due to the orders of the government urging the general public to travel as little as possible during this period of the year so that motive power can be used for transporting war supplies.

#### CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

To the Honorable Commission, City of La Grande, Oregon, Gentlemen:—

I herewith submit my report for the week ending February 18, 1918: Fire Chief reports no fires for the week. Fireman Ashman's resignation having been accepted, Claire Davis has been installed to take his place.

Chief of Police reports eleven arrests for the week: one state case; number drunks, three; disorderly conduct, two, I. W. W., two; bootleggers, three; number convicted, four; number paroled, two. Two awaiting instructions from Federal District Attorney. Amount of fines and forfeitures, \$125.00. Amount collected from pound, \$5.00.

Water Superintendent's report shows total expenditures for week for water and street department, \$96.85. Water department is charged with \$29.60; Street Department, \$67.25. During this week we have used gravel on various streets and hauled gravel on road leading to the Oro Dell bridge near intersection of North Alder.

It required 28 1-2 yards of gravel to make the necessary repairs on the Oro Dell road. This was done at a cost of \$28.38. In view of the fact that we are maintaining our own team I submit these figures to you. Careful record has been kept of the cost of the team from the time we have been using the same to date, showing that we are able to maintain same at a cost of \$1.75 per day for the horses. We pay the driver \$2.75 per day, making the total cost per day of the team \$4.50. This cost can be reduced as soon as the new hay can be purchased as the quantity and summer price
