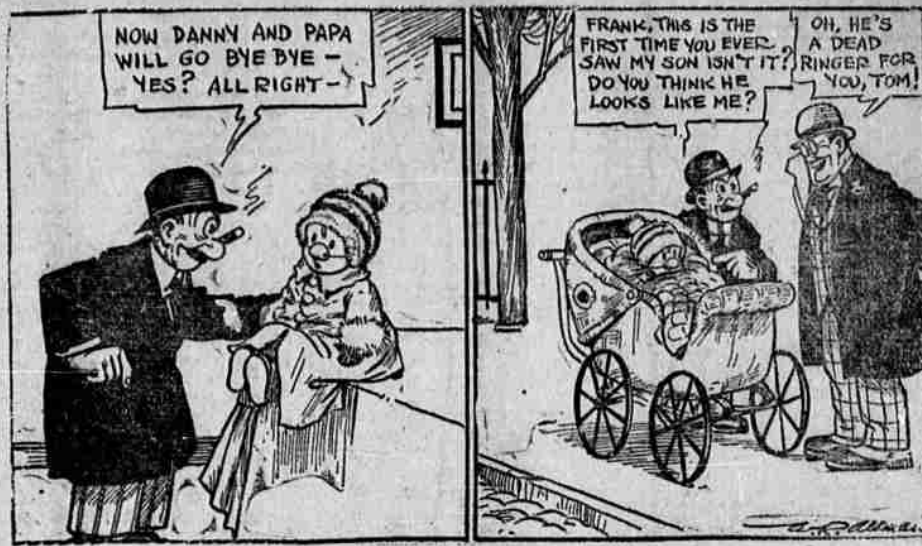

BEST FED AND BEST CLOTHED ARMY IN WORLD

Better Cared for Than Any Soldier at Front. HOW HE FARES "OVER THERE" Clothing Supply Larger Than Most of the Soldiers Owned in Civil Life—Food Contains No Delicacies, but is Plentiful and Substantial—Barracks and Huts Are Always Kept Warm—Rail President's Sun a Chauffeur.

(By a Californian With the American Forces in France.) My Dear — You will note by the above that my address is changed. I am now a candidate. I am a candidate for a commission. It was very unexpected—particularly on my part. As near as I can figure out, it was decided to organize a training camp over here on the lines of those in the states and give the fellows who enlisted early or who were in the original army a chance. All the regiments over here were invited to send a certain quota and I was one of five from my regiment. We train three months, according to program, under more or less actual war conditions, and, if we pass at the end of that time, get shoulder straps. I only got here yesterday. I am a private entirely surrounded by military talent. A sort of an island. There is only one other private in the school. There are men here who were in the training camps in the states and quit to get over here quick, men who chased Pancho Villa in Mexico, men who have been in the trenches and explored No Man's Land, and sergeants, top sergeants and sergeant-majors who have been in the regular army for years. But there is no one over thirty-two. I am closer to the front than I was before, by a good many miles—so close that it is beginning to look blameworthy. I was talking to one of the fellows who was in the trenches this morning. They don't go into details, but say that it isn't so uncomfortable. They are firm in the belief that when the Americans start they will keep going. In the quiet sector they were

In, they say, the principal aim of both sides seemed to be to keep the peace. A French sentry told one of them: "If you see a German, don't shoot; you'll only start trouble." "Hell," said the American, "that's what we're here for." The men live fairly comfortably in the dugouts, he said. In one that he was in there were three or four rooms, an electric light plant and even a piano. Best-Clothed Army. This camp is located at which I think was an old French armory. We are quartered in a sturdy stone building three stories high. No electric lights; (Continued on Page 8.)

That's just what I would like to do," he said, "but I'm no good as a soldier. They won't let me go." Ready to die for his country and not fit to do that! And as I thought of his sad answer my eyes rested again on those reverent boys before me who were preparing themselves for battle by commemorating the Lord's death, and renewing their allegiance to Him. "The best soldier," said Major-General O'Ryan, "is the soldier with a religion." Is it true?

Mr. Grain Farmer:

Are you prepared to handle your grain in bulk? Do not wait until Spring and Summer when you are buried with work and worried with labor shortage, but build your granaries now. You can buy the lumber and roofing paper for a first-class 1000 bushel portable granary for \$64.58 and it will last for years. Sacks for the same amount of grain will cost you \$125.00 and this would be a dead loss against this year's crop. A granary of this size can be moved anywhere and can be filled directly from the thrasher, doing away with high priced labor handling and sewing sacks. The boys in the trenches need the sacks for sand bags for the protection of their very lives and perhaps your boy is among them. Spend your money in your own valley by buying lumber manufactured at home. When you buy sacks part of the money goes to India. BUILD YOUR GRANARIES NOW Be prepared by building them before the farming season opens up. Be sure to get good lumber, well seasoned, as low grade lumber will give you trouble in a few seasons. Don't use green lumber. Save money—keep what you spend at home—prevent loss and damage from exposure to weather—leave the sacks for our boys in the trenches; help win the war by building granaries now. Portable granaries of this type are universally used in other sections. One trip with a good team will haul the material for one granary.
