The flag is white, with red letters saying that "Food will win the war" at the top. Beneath is a shield in a circle and on the circle are heads of wheat. To the Multnomah men, Eric V. Hauser and H. H. Cloutier, the flag means that they are doing a patriotic duty in saving food stuffs at the big Portland hotel. They are as proud of their efforts on that line as they were of the response to the liberty loan party which they carried over Central and Eastern Oregon in an auto—the yellow demon. It is believed that the Multnomah flag is the first one west of Chicago.

"The
