ORDERED TO PUBLISH LIST  
 Property Owners Delinquent in Assessments to Be Notified.  
 Carrying out a policy outlined some time ago the city commission met last night at its regular session and ordered the city manager to proceed with the filing of all property owners delinquent in improvement assessments and pay them up for publication in the same manner that the county publishes the delinquent tax list. Approximately 275,000 remains to be collected today in the day set when penalties will be attached if payment has not been made.  
 The Commission also ordered the City Manager to secure figures on the cost of establishing a grade at Washington and Walnut streets so the streets may be accessible to citizens of that section of the city. This was done in reply to a petition asking for the same signed freely by residents of the district.
