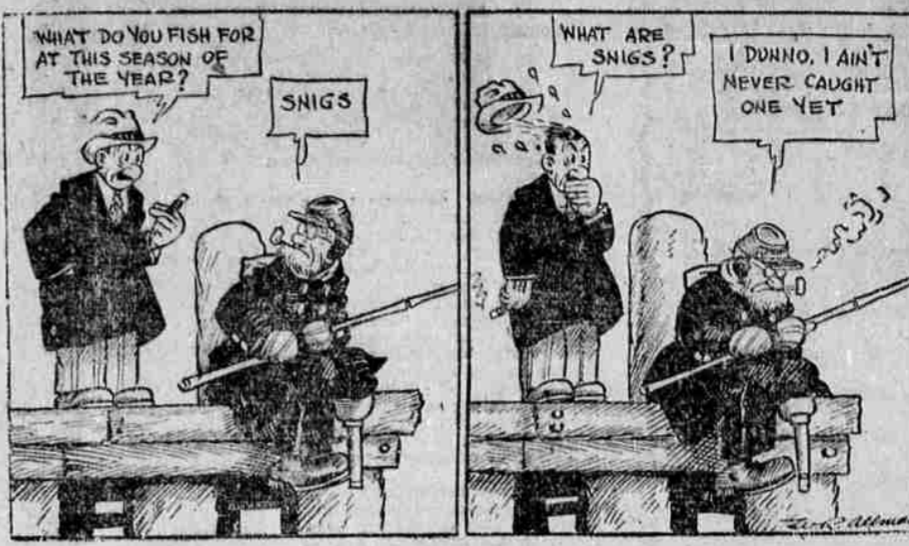

The sale of War Savings Stamps and Thrift Stamps is progressing well in the Joseph schools. According to a communication from State School Supt. J. A. Churchill every \$20.00 worth of his or her quota during the year 1918.

Including Liberty bonds purchased during the last drive, Joseph school people own \$1772.50 worth of war loans. This is distributed as follows: Miss Troedson's room, \$74.75; Miss Earsley's room, \$101.25; Miss Leslie's room, \$108.00; Miss Walker's room, \$409.00; Miss Schott's room, \$57.50; Miss Spaulding's room, \$352.50; Mr. Wilson's room \$224.00; high school, \$488.25 teachers, \$276. In addition to this about \$500 worth of war savings certificates have been sold by school boys to people not in school, this bringing the total up to \$3212. Selwyn Gaulke reported the sale of \$100.00 worth last week and has thus earned membership in the Junior Rainbow regiment.

Control of Apple Leaf Roller Is Explained By Expert. The apple growers held a meeting at Imbler Tuesday afternoon. Lee Roy Childs, superintendent of the experiment station at The Dalles explained to the growers the results he has gained in regard to the control of the apple leaf roller. The growers will continue to use the oil spray in the future as they have in the past. Two car loads of oil will be required to spray the orchards in that vicinity. Fortunately this pest is not found in other parts of the county.

PENDLETON, Or.—All business houses except restaurants, are closed nightly at 11 o'clock now, under the rulings of an ordinance effective March 1. While restaurants can remain open they cannot sell anything except food and their supplies of cigars, tobacco, soft drinks, candies and bakery supplies are not to be open to the public after that hour. On Saturday night an exception is made, and business places may remain open until midnight.

There are now 50,927 registered voters in Multnomah county eligible to vote at the primary election May 17, according to latest tabulations.

As Provided On Recommendation of State Council of Defense.

The new schedule for delivery service in La Grande, as requested by the State Council of Defense, has been arranged as follows: Outside North District (including everything east of Spruce, north of Z and west of Second)—One delivery each day, leaving at 9 o'clock. North District (from Second to Fir)—Leaves twice each day, at 9 o'clock in the morning and 2 o'clock in the afternoon. North District (from Fir to Spruce)—Leaves twice each day, at 10:30 a. m. and 4:30 p. m. East District (from Washington to Jefferson)—Leaves each day at 9 o'clock in the morning and at 2 o'clock in the afternoon. East District (south of Washington avenue)—Leaves each day at 10:30 in the morning and 4:30 in the afternoon. South District (from M Avenue to A street)—Leaves once each day at 2 o'clock in the afternoon. South District (from Main to N Avenue)—Leaves each day at 9 in the morning and 2 in the afternoon.
