DEATH RATE IS HIGH IN COAL MINES

The demoralization forced upon the coal mining industry by wartime conditions is said by the Bureau of Mines to be responsible for the highest fatality record from accidents in that industry in the last seven years.

During the year 1917 there were 2,695 men killed in coal mining, which is an increase of 479 over the previous year.

Statement by Secretary Lane "At least, temporarily" it gives a black eye to the splendid efforts of the Bureau of Mines in its campaign with the miners and mine operators for safer conditions," said Secretary of the Interior Lane. "Until the war struck us there had been a decreasing death rate which was much gratifying to the men of the bureau of mines, as well as to myself. There had been the utmost cooperation between the industry and the bureau and it had begun to appear as if we had passed those disgraceful days when human life was cheaper than a mine mule.

Due to Changing Conditions.

"Although the war has changed all this for the time being, it is still our duty to analyze and see if we can not correct some of the conditions even during the war, for a single life saved is not only humane but a step toward victory. The unfortunate death toll of last year is undoubtedly due to the fact that the industry has been speeded and retarded spasmodically throughout the year. There was the unusual demand for coal, the uncertainty of prices at the mines, the failure at times of the transportation facilities, and the changing of markets to avoid long unnecessary hauls, the difficulty in obtaining experienced men to offset enlistments, the draft, and miners voluntarily returning to their countries in Europe to take

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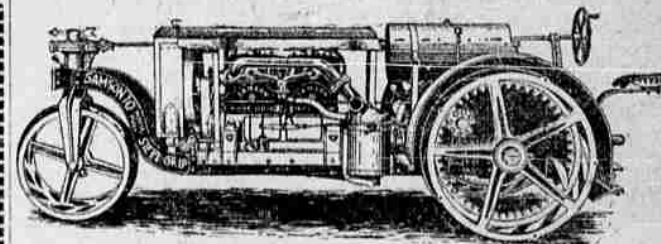
