The Bookworm

Mrs. S. A. Roe will read short stories at the library tomorrow (Sunday) at three o'clock. You are invited to come with your friends, whether you are a library cardholder or not. No admission is charged.

It would be an admirable conservation of labor if all women could follow the example of our model knitters, and learn to knit and read at the same time. If that is to hard try memorizing as you knit. This takes less looking on the book than reading. There are poems worth learning in the magazines and newspapers. Your taste may run to lists of presidents, or the kings of England. Can you remember the capitals of all the states, or say the multiplication tables up to 25? Can you remember the names of the books of the Bible in order? The old custom of learning Bible chapters by heart is worth reviving. A practical task is to learn the tables of food values in the text-books—how many calories are in the various things we eat? Every science has its memory task to start with. Do you know the names of the chemical elements and their symbols, the outline of the botanical classification, or the antidotes to the common poisons. If you are ambitious you may learn to conjugate the French irregular verbs before summer.

"Know Oregon," is the name of a game which may be borrowed from the library. It contains one hundred questions and answers on the industries and resources of the state, arranged on cards to make an interesting and instructive pastime for children. It is published by Miss Emma M. Griebel of Portland.

Ask at the library for "The housekeeper's handbook of cleaning," by Sarah J. MacLeod; "Removal of stains from clothing and other textiles," (Farmers' bulletin 341); "Methods of cleaning (O. A. C. College bulletin 213).

Mrs. Willis, librarian of the Elgin public library, was a visitor at the La Grande library Tuesday. Mrs. Willis has just returned to La Grande the state travelling library which has been used in Elgin during the winter, and received another in return. She also made a selection from the other state library books on exhibit here. These books are also for the use of La Grande people.

Another travelling library was sent to Mt. Glen this week. This was the first one sent out under the new plan by which the local stations save freight. The books are exchanged here instead of being sent back to Salem each time.

A shipment of new books includes a number of popular volumes on the war. One of the most striking is "Kultur in Cartoons," by Louis Raemaekers. The artist has risen from a life of obscurity to the position of a famous cartoonist.

The lightly shaded portion is Nationalist Ireland—much of which is also strongly Sinn Féin.

You can buy the lumber and roofing paper for a first-class 1600 bushel portable granary for \$54.58 and it will last for years. Sacks for the same amount of grain will cost you \$125.00 and this would be a dead loss against this year's crop.

A granary of this size can be moved anywhere and can be filled directly from the thresher, doing away with high priced labor handling and sewing sacks.
