 1/2 cup fat.
 3 eggs.
 1 cup milk.
 4 teaspoons baking powder.
 1/2 teaspoon salt.
 3/4 cup barley flour.
 1-2-3 cups white flour.
 Note—If pastry flour is used, use 1 cup barley flour and 2 cups pastry flour.
 If dark cases, molasses, or chocolate, as high a proportion as one-half barley flour may be used.
