MOVIE SHOWS MEN GOING OVER THE TOP.

Some of the most elaborate battle scenes ever recorded by the motion picture camera, with the possible exception of "shots" actually made at the front, are shown in the Triangle play, "The Gown of Destiny," starring Alva Rubens, at the Star Theater on Thursday and Friday. This play was adapted from Earl Der Biggers' Saturday Evening Post story, "Each According to His Gifts."

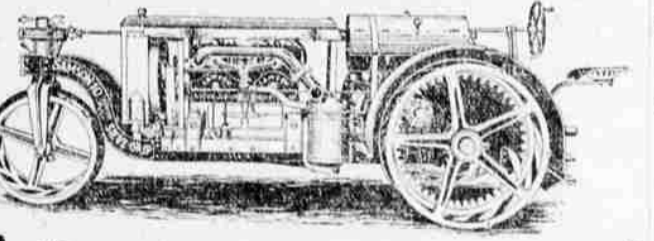
