And strange to say a good many of the big income tax payers did not reckon with that feature when the law was passed or amended. A man bought a ranch east of the mountains and still owes a hundred thousand dollars on it, but his crop the past year brought him in \$25,000. Think of the income tax he must pay for every dollar above \$5,000 takes the excess profit tax as well as the income and war tax amounting in graduated form until it reaches as high as 13 per cent. Of course larger incomes must pay much more in proportion and the million dollar income is hit for 60 per cent. True, in many cases where this excess profit tax was not considered and a man has bought a big ranch with a small payment down he is surely hard hit. His hope is for this year's crop to be large enough to take care of both himself and Uncle Sam.
