The ordinance which you passed in the previous meeting, in regard to restricting and regulating the movements of the I. W. W.'s has been sent to other cities in the country that some municipal legislation may be enacted there and a co-ordination of municipal effort be secured to eliminate the I. W. W. movement. It has become generally recognized that the I. W. W. is not a labor organization but a pro-German and revolutionary organization.
