Agitation Among Workers.

HOT LAKE, March 24.—(To the Editor)—Dear Sir:—The recent controversy in England between the government and the Amalgamated Society of Engineers (shipbuilding and munitions) now happily settled brought out much bitter feeling between the "boys" at the front and a few of those left behind, at home, to supply the very necessary backing in ships and munitions. Thank God there was only a very few to which the enclosed verses applied and it must be the endeavor of all of us here to see that such appellation never shall be deserved of our shipbuilders and munition workers who are responsible for the lives and safety of our noble and self-sacrificing boys who are today and will be for many days to come offering their lives on the sacrificial altar to protect the lives of those of us left at home.

Is there any danger of it happening?

A close observer of men and matters of today can see discontent and agitation amongst workers, only a little, true, but as a spark of fire may, if not quenched, develop into a holocaust, so must such treason be stamped out in its embryonic state and that only by a thorough extermination of the initial spark. The enclosed verses appeared in the Liverpool Daily Post, February 2, 1918. Is there any danger of our workers becoming contaminated, and singing this song? Let us watch out and take action at the first signs of it.

(4) In order to save wheat, little or no macaroni should be used at this time. Use instead home-made noodles of egg and barley flour. These may be boiled and drained like macaroni. Arrange in layers in a baking dish, sprinkle each layer with cornstarch, add a seasoning of pepper and salt and a layer of grated or very thinly sliced cheese. Grated or very thinly sliced cheese between each layer of cooked noodles or macaroni. Have a layer of cheese on top and cover this with a layer of sifted crumbs or crumbled corn flakes to prevent its getting hard and horny. Pour in from the side enough skim milk or tomato juice to come to the top layer of noodles. Bake until thoroughly heated through and delicate brown on top. Serve hot in place of meat on meatless days. Potatoes are not needed with this dish, but one or two other vegetables should accompany it or a substantial mixed vegetable salad may follow it.
