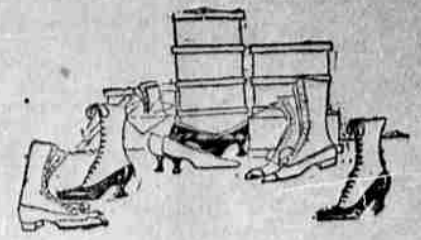

- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup white flour

Save 1/2 cup of the scalded flour for bread. Four milk over corn meal, add shortening and salt. When cold, add sifted flour and baking powder. Roll out lightly on floured board. Cut with biscuit cutter and bake in greased pan fifteen to twenty minutes.
