He first stated that he was not financially able to buy a bond and other employes of the shops offered to buy a bond for him. This offer he refused. A boiler maker, residing that Ambrose was not as full handed as his fellow workmen, offered him fifty dollars with which to purchase a

bond, and he still refused. About this time the shop boys became so incensed over remarks he made, that it looked like a little rough handling might result, but an officer from the sheriff's office appeared on the scene and took Mr. Ambrose in charge.  
It was not the man's inability to buy a bond that incited the trouble, but an unpatriotic suggestion that Ambrose made against the war situation. He was released this morning and allowed to return to work. He has a small family and lives in the northern part of town.

I have been requested by all the members of this unit to try and convey to you our great appreciation of your patriotic and loyal devotion to those to whom has been given the honor of serving their country abroad.  
The time, labor and money, so unselfishly given, not only makes our camp life more home-like, but makes us better soldiers for we know the many kind thoughts and good wishes that comes with it. Words fail me to thank you but hope that our deeds will repay you for the confidence you place in us.  
We are having some real pleasant weather, and it makes us all feel much better. We do not have a single one at sick call these days.  
We are working at present with the French in one of their evacuating hospitals. It contains 1500 beds and when completed will have 3000 beds. Most of the boys take to the work very quickly and the French officers tell me that they are very well pleased with their work.  
We have purchased several candle lamps for their billets. Candles are not a very good light to read and write by and these lamps will make a much better light.  
Please remember us to all our friends at home.
