HEAVY CHROME SHIPMENTS.

Grant County Supplies Government With Needed Commodity.

PRAIRIE, Ore., April 23.—The chrome business is assuming proportions that mean a mighty prosperous year for Grant County. During the coming season, it is probable that chrome will bring more money into this section than any other industry.

The Government needs chrome and there is every reason to believe that it will be only a short time until they will take a hand in getting it out. Prices have advanced steadily and will probably continue to go up.

The amount shipped this year is limited only by transportation facilities. The roads are getting in fair shape and from now on every available team and motor truck will be on the road.

People interested in the business estimate that in a short time at least 100 tons a day will be coming into Prairie for shipment. Three concerns that are buying and handling chrome plan to ship more than this amount, and in addition there are a number of smaller shippers. This amount of chrome will be a problem for the S. V. Ry. to handle in addition to their other freight. The rate from Prairie to Baker is \$3.50 a ton and the transportation charge at Baker is 25c per ton. The railroads revenue from chrome will amount to a large sum during the year.

It is probable that the road and bridges on this end will be put in better shape soon, in order that the heavier locomotives of the company can be used. One hundred tons of chrome a day means that there will be a Sumpter Valley train out of Prairie daily with nothing but chrome. And the biggest shipments will probably be in the fall, when there is also wool and cattle to take out.

Figuring this chrome at \$20 a ton in Prairie, and it probably averages more, then chrome will soon be bringing this community \$2000 per day.

There are some tremendous lessons to be learned from the present status of the world strife.

One of the most momentous of them all is a lesson to America and Americans—a lesson to you and me—a personal lesson which we shall do well to accept in its fullest, personal application. It is the lesson of INDIVIDUAL INTEREST in this war.

The blood of American soldiers is wet upon the trenches, and the base hospitals are ministering to American wounded. The blood of our sacrifice reeks upon the altar. It is now a personal affair.

We—you and I—must back our boys in the trenches, or forever cease to claim rank and title as Americans.
