The Ted Thye-Jack Harbertson match is declared off. Harbertson wrestled John Berg at Spokane last Friday night, and was injured by being thrown with a toe hold. The news of his injury and the disappointment to the Club and the fans came as considerable of a shock as this is the second match to "blow up" within the past two months.
