WILL PRESENT DRAMA. Satire On Modern Mannish Women By High School.

There have been some good stunt shows and musical attractions in La Grande this winter, but the one opportunity to see an entire drama in that presented in the annual senior play. This year's production promises to be one of the best ever given here and friends of the High School are looking forward eagerly to next Friday night. The play chosen is one of unusual freshness and humor and is well suited to amateur actors; the cast has been carefully chosen from a talented group of young people; and in Miss Williamson, the students have a director of experience and ability.

The play, entitled "The Amazons" was written by Sir Arthur Wing Pinero and is a good-natured satire on the modern mannish woman. Lady Castlejordan, bitterly disappointed because her children are all girls, has raised her three daughters as boys. They dress and act as young men and all goes well until Cupid upsets the mother's schemes.

The plot of the play is fresh and original, the lines are clever and funny to the last degree, the characters are excellently well drawn, and the semi-masculine attire of the girls adds to the charm of the performance. The setting of the first two scenes is an overgrown corner of Overcote Park and the third is in the gymnasium of Overcote Hall.

Denny Glaze, as the bigoted English lord, reads his lines with a true sense of humor. Leal Russell, as a Frenchman, plays havoc with the English language and exhibits "identity of mustache and vivacity" in free French style. Clyde Bunting is a good-natured college man who goes a-wooing with the other two. The roles of the three athletic young women are taken by Imogen Orton, Estelle Graybill, and Marguerite Winters, and Lady Castlejordan, the mother, is played by Ruth Courtney. Others having parts in the play are: Zela Lottland, Howard Stoddard, George McDonald, Ralph Root and Frank Patton.
