New appeals from Surgeon-General Gorgas for 5,000 medical men, and from Surgeon-General Draisted for 2,000, have been received. We urgently ask your co-operation in meeting these requests.

We have written and sent blanks to physicians whom we know to be eligible. Have those eligible in your district fill out their blanks and send them to their examiner, with a request that they be advised when to appear for examination. A supply of blanks has been sent to each examiner, but this office will send more if needed.

Please send us the names and addresses of available men who are eligible to membership in the Medical Reserve Corps, additional to those previously sent us.

Time is precious. Our boys in the service must be assured the very best attention. They are getting it, and will continue to receive it if we get the best men into the Reserve Corps and keep at all times on the roll an available number of the reputable men of the profession.
