HORTICULTURAL NOTES Methods of Spraying and Other Means Against Pests. (By Paul H. Spillman, County Agent.)

The codling moth or common apple worm is the most common insect enemy of the apple in this section. Arsenate of lead is also generally known as the best spray to use in its control.

The time for the subsequent sprays is not generally understood. By careful experimental work it has been found that the moth does not begin to fly until the thermometer registers 60 degrees at 5 p. m. (old time.)

The third spray is again regulated by the appearance of the moth that lays the eggs from which the worm hatches. The most satisfactory way to do this is to place some wormy apples of the first brood in a cage that is so built the moth cannot escape when it hatches and watch for the appearance of the moth.

In the application of the lead one pound of the powder or two of the paste to fifty gallons of water will do the work.

The Cherry Slug. For several years the cherry trees of Union county have been partially defoliated by a small black slug. These slugs seemed to become suddenly numerous just about the time the cherries began to ripen.
