PUREBREDS SENT TO IDAHO

Cattlemen at Union Sell Shorthorns To Welser Resident.

Sherman and Hutchison of Union have been in the pure breed Shorthorn cattle business but a short time, in fact only two years. Nevertheless the class of stock which they have purchased for foundation stock is of such a character that they have had a lively demand for all the young stuff that they care to dispose of, those that are producing best in the way of pure breed livestock. I is being demonstrated more each year that Union county is the pure bred livestock breeding centers of the Northwest. It is up to our breeders of this class of livestock to sustain this reputation and they certainly show no indications of not doing so as the present time.

The above mentioned breeders of pure breed Shorthorn cattle sold recently to C. Meyers of Welser, Idaho, seven head of yearling heifers at a figure considerably higher than prime three year old steers are bringing at the present and if you have followed the market you know that such steers will bring at least \$150. These young heifers are to be used as foundation stock in starting a herd of pure breed Shorthorn cattle in the Welser section.
