A TREAT AHEAD.

La Grande is a few miles eastward of the center line of totality of the eclipse of the sun on June 8. Baker is almost in the exact center of the path and, therefore, is the point which has attracted a large number of astronomers and scientists. These men, versed in such affairs, would have traveled many thousands of miles to go to Skomokawa or to Thief Lake instead of Baker if either of these localities were the advantage. But the view of the eclipse will be almost as good at La Grande as elsewhere, and what is lacking here in the length of duration will be more than made up in an illustrated lecture, of which the people here will have the benefit without trouble or expense.

Prof. Sidney Dean Townley, a brother of County Commissioner W. J. Townley, will be the lecturer. The subject of astronomy and its co-relative science, mathematics, has been a specialty with Prof. Townley for many years, and what he may have to offer on the subject may be accepted as coming from the fountain branch of science.

The laity, or that innumerable majority of people who know nothing about the movements, the measurements and the other differentiations concerning the heavenly bodies, can depend only on what is told them. But there is no lack of faith in their preceptors for the reason that such phenomena as eclipses, comets, measurements of the solar year and all the illimitable facts pertaining to the heavenly bodies are forecasted with an accuracy which would seem to make those conversant with such affairs as belonging to the cult of the superhuman. It is, like many other things mysterious, easy enough to those who know. It is principally matter of mathematics—the only perfect science.

To say that the approaching eclipse will come as it does; that it will be "total" in certain parts of the earth's surface and to tell within the hour and the minute when the eclipse will appear, seems like magic, and still it is simple enough to those who know how to figure it out.

A good deal which appears as mystery will probably be made plain by Prof. Townley when he delivers his illustrated lecture in La Grande. The people of the community are very fortunate, indeed to have the privilege of hearing a man who is on the "inside" of these mysteries.
