Knitters Attention
The Chapter has inaugurated a new system of knitting accounting by cards. Each applicant for yarn is given a yellow card on which is entered the name of the person who wishes the yarn, the name of the one who received it and the garment to be made. A duplicate white card is kept by the Chapter. The yellow card must always be brought in either to receive more yarn or to turn in the finished garment. No

garment can be turned in without the yellow card. Hereafter when a knitted garment is turned in to headquarters there will be placed on it a tag bearing a number which will be recorded. This with all other knitted garments bearing a tag will at the end of the month be turned over to the committee on inspection. Mrs. H. Grady, Chairman, La Grande Chapter is one of 20 Chapters out of 120 in the Division that is in line for the honor roll. The Chairman of Military Relief

will be required to sign an agreement to send socks with Kitchener toes only, and ALL gray. The Division is receiving ONLY GRAY yarn. This is supplied them by Washington Headquarters of the Red Cross. Why not accept this as the correct color then? We print below an extract from the talk of supervisor of knitting given at the institution.

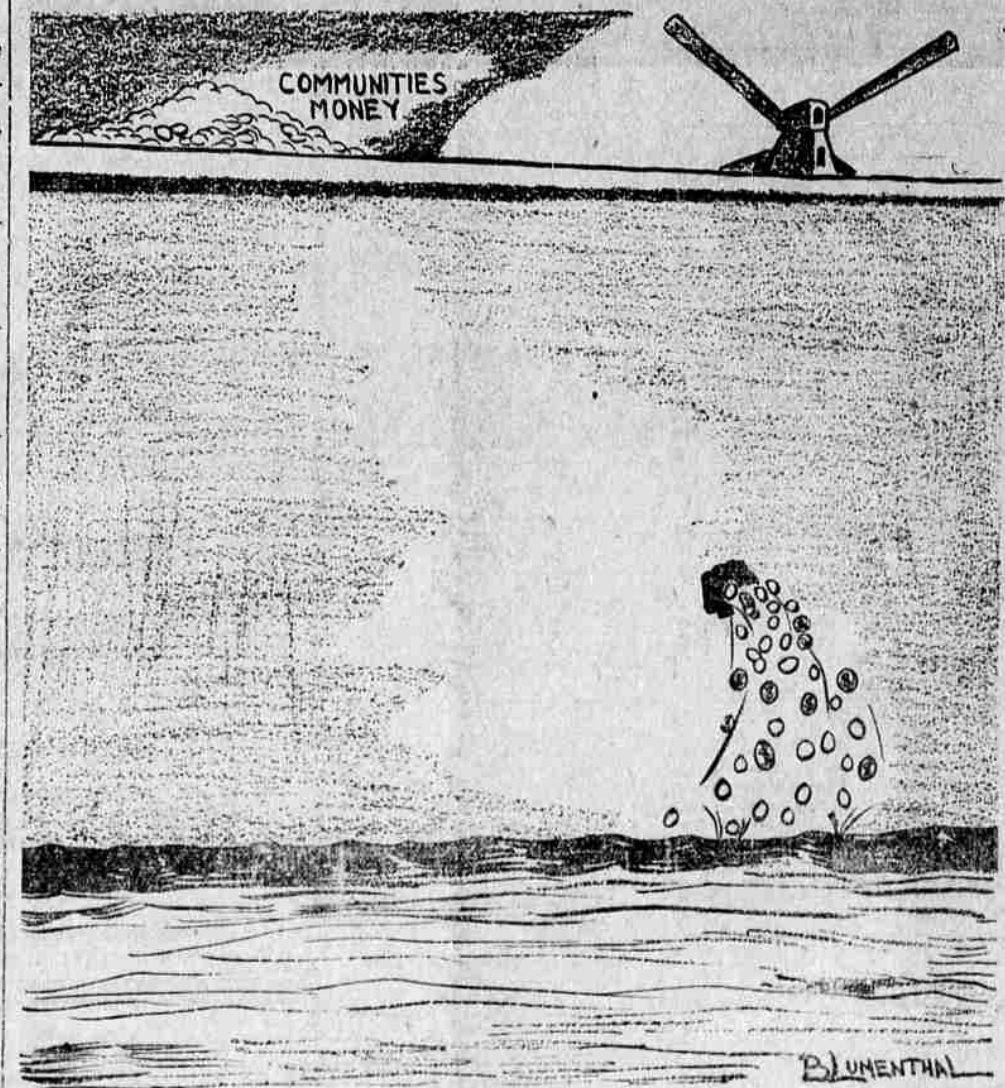
