PROPOSALS FOR CONSTRUCTION OF A NATIONAL FOREST ROAD.

United States Department of Agriculture, Office of Public Roads and Rural Engineering, District No. 1, Portland, Oregon—Sealed proposals addressed to the Secretary of Agriculture of the United States, and endorsed "Proposal for building the Flora-Enterprise National Forest Road," in the Wallowa National Forest, County of Wallowa, State of Oregon, will be received by the District Engineer, Office of Public Roads and Rural Engineering, at his office, Room 202, Broadway-Yamhill Building, Portland, Oregon, until 2 o'clock P.M. of the 27th day of June, 1918, and at that time and place publicly opened and read. Principal items of construction—clearing, grubbing, grading and construction of culverts. Approximate length of road, 13 miles.
