Are you prepared to handle your grain in bulk? Do not wait until Spring and Summer when you are buried with work and worried with labor shortage, but build your granaries now.

HOME ECONOMICS

MILK AND THE DIET.

Milk is the best food investment that you can make at the present time, because it is highest in actual food value, and it is safe, good and cheap. It is essential that milk should be kept in the diet of children as long as possible. It can be assimilated, taken up into the tissues of the body much easier than any other food and 1 quart of whole milk will produce more heat, energy and building material than 8 eggs, 1 pound of lean beef, or 7/8 pounds of pork.

A quart a day for every child, if possible, a pint without fail. Plenty of milk will help give all your children, big and little, the chance for health they ought to have. Buy more milk and less meat and your family will be better fed.

Milk gives your children lime and other salts which they need. There must be plenty of lime in their food, for a great deal of it is needed for their bones and teeth and a little for their blood and all other parts of their bodies. Right food, not drugs, is what children need. Big boys and girls and grown people, as well as children, need lime, because the bones are constantly wearing away little by little and must be replaced. Milk is the chief food for lime. It is much richer in it than other common foods.

Milk gives your children the body building protein, one of the materials from which their bodies are made. Milk is like eggs and meat in this. The body-building substance, the protein of milk, is not new to you, for curd is milk protein. Cottage cheese is curd separated out from milk. When we drink milk or eat cheese we give our bodies proteins which are changed and become part of our muscles, blood, and other parts of the body. The milk protein is good for everybody and especially good for children. They need a great deal of it because their bodies grow so fast.

Milk gives your children fuel to burn in their bodies. They need the fuel to keep them warm and to help them run and play and work, much as an automobile needs gasoline or a steam engine needs

They are so active that they need more fuel for their size than grown people do. The fat and the milk sugar and the protein in the milk all burn up as fuel. Milk is much cheaper fuel than meat. A quart gives the same amount of fuel as a whole pound of lean meat or 8 eggs. Think of the cost! Isn't the milk far the cheapest. Still less expensive fuel is a bowl of bread and milk or corn meal mush and milk. Skim milk is good food. It has the lime and protein and sugar of the whole milk. Use it, but use whole milk, too. Skim milk lacks fat and has not so much of a growth substance as has whole milk. For the purpose of stimulating growth, and especially to children, butter fat has no substitute. During this last winter when much agitation arose in some of the larger cities over the price of milk, which was advanced from 2 to 3 cents per quart by reason of the rapid rise in the cost of food and labor, many families among the poorer classes were found giving their children tea and coffee instead of milk. Such methods of feeding fail to nourish the child properly. The widest possible publicity should be carried on through public channels to bring these essential facts to the attention of all mothers. Be sure your milk is clean and fresh. If you live in the city, buy it pasteurized from a clean dairy. In the country see that your cows and milkers are clean and healthy. Keep your milk clean, cold and covered. In spite of the shortage of milk in Germany, that country has at all hazards maintained the milk ration of the children and in the hospitals even though to do so has meant that the adult population has had to forego largely its use. In a "safety first" campaign it must be remembered that it should be "children first."
