Sealed bids will be received by the Oregon State Highway Commission at the office of its Chairman, at 1301 Yeon Building, Portland, Oregon, at 11 a.m. on the 9th day of July, 1918, for grading work in Union County, between La Grande and Enterprise, locally known as the Elgin-Minam Project, as follows:

Approximately 48,000 cubic yards of excavation. The length of the improvement is approximately 3.55 miles.

This is a co-operative post road project, the government and State furnish funds jointly, the work, however, is to be under the direction and supervision of the State Highway Engineer.

No bids will be considered unless accompanied by cash, bidder's bond or certified check for an amount equal to at least five per cent of the total amount of the bid.

A corporate surety bond will be required for the faithful performance of the contract in a sum equal to one-half the total amount of the bid.

All proposals must be delivered in person by the bidder or his duly authorized agent at the place and hour above-mentioned. Proposal blanks and full information for bidders may be obtained at the office of the State Highway Engineer at Salem, Ore.

Plans and specifications and forms of contract may be seen at the same place and at the office of the Division Engineer, M. O. Bennett, Pendleton, Oregon, or may be obtained from the Salem office upon the deposit of \$5.
